# Lesson 4: Jesus in Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua

• In Genesis we saw the origins of Israel as a family; in Exodus they were a captive nation in Egypt; in Leviticus they marked time at Mt Sinai while God instructed them how to come to Him in worship

### Jesus in Numbers

- Numbers records Israel's wandering in the desert as a judgment of their unbelief in God's promise
- Chapter 1 isn't exciting, but has several important aspects:
  - Compare the totals in v1:46 & v26:51--the # went down rather than up--the cost of disobedience to God
  - Proof of genealogy was needed for even being considered a Jew, for serving as a priest or owning land; also important for us since the Messiah had to be descended from David (2 Samuel 7:12-16)
  - o Your most important lineage is being a child & heir of God thru faith in Jesus--(Romans 8:17)
- The blessings in v6:24-26 are administered by Jesus: bless & keep (v24--John 10:28; Ephesians 1:3-14); face shine upon you (v25a--John 8:12); gracious (v25b--Acts 15:11); give you peace (v26--John 14:27)
- Chapter 7--repetitive, but illustrates that God takes note of every gift, just like the widow's (Luke 21:2)
- God specifies how the Levites must be purified by human ceremony in order to approach Him (v8:5-14)
  - Jesus has purified us in His blood (1 John 1:7-9) & pure water (Ephesians 5:26; Hebrews 10:22)
  - Water alludes to baptism & living water (John 4:10); blood & water evoke His piercing (John 19:34)
- God's simple travel directions--follow Him (*v9:17-18*); believe in Jesus & love one another (**1 John 3:23**)
  - Yet Moses begged his brother-in-law to guide (v10:31); we do the same when we conform to the world
- The Jews grew tired of the nourishing manna (*v11:4-9*), as some find God's Word tiresome & don't study
- Moses agreed to scout the land (**Deuteronomy 1:19-25**) & God consented (*v13:1-3*) but it wasn't needed
  - Spying & fear showed lack of faith in God (v14:1-10)--Joshua & Caleb would be the only adults from the 1<sup>st</sup> census who would enter the land (v14:29-35); our faith is based on Jesus (Matthew 28:20)
- The water of cleansing (v19:9) foreshadowed the cleansing power of Jesus' blood (Hebrews 9:12-14)
- Aaron's staff budded, blossomed & produced almonds (v17:8)--foreshadowed Jesus' resurrection
- The Lord told Moses to speak to the rock for water (v20.8), but he angrily struck it twice (v20.11)
  - o Moses & Aaron would not enter the promised land--they had not upheld God's holiness (v20:12)
  - The rock represented Jesus, who was to suffer once--Moses had already struck a rock in Exodus
     17:1-7
  - The water quenched their thirst, as our spiritual thirst is quenched in Jesus (1 Corinthians 10:1-4)
- Aaron died & son Eleazar was installed high priest (v20:28); Jesus is High Priest forever (Hebrews 6:20)

- The Jews again complained & God sent deadly snakes (*v21:4-6*); then said to put up a bronze snake (*v21:8*); as looking to the lifted snake brought healing, we look to Jesus for eternal life (**John 3:14-15**)
- God used a pagan prophet, Balaam, to prophecy to Jesus: "A star. .a scepter" (v24:17; Matthew 2:2)
  - Yet Balaam was a false teacher who advised leading the Hebrews into sin (v25:1-9; Revelation 2:14)
- God established cities of refuge for those who accidentally killed (*v35:11-12*); but we, who deserve death for our sins, find refuge in Jesus, who assumed our penalty on the cross (1 Peter 3:18; Romans 8:1-2)

### Jesus in Deuteronomy

- This is the 5<sup>th</sup> book of the *Pentateuch* (5 books by Moses); theme--covenant renewal; love & obey God
  - The Jews had arrived at the Jordan (Numbers 33:49) & would spend a month here before crossing
  - This book was for the children of those whose unbelief brought death in the desert (Numbers 14:29)
- Spies & fear (v1:22-36)--not the last time humans determined to over-ride God's clearly-stated will
- God said "no" when Moses begged to be allowed to cross over (*v3:25-27*); He also said "no" to Jesus in Gethsemane (Mark 14:35-36) & He says "no" to us when it fits His purpose (Romans 8:28,31-32)
- When asked "which is the greatest commandment?" Jesus cited *v4-5* (Mark 12:28-33), part of the *Shema* 
  - LORD--YHWH (Jehovah); God--Elohim; a plural form which accommodates the doctrine of the Trinity
  - Just knowing *about* our triune God (*v4*) is insufficient; He wants us to *know* personally & intimately
  - o Love--noun & verb; as a verb, implies action in commitment & obedience (John 14:15; 1 John 3:18)
- When tempted by Satan (**Matthew 4:1-11**) Jesus responded from *v8:3* "Man does not live by bread alone;" *v6:16* "Do not test the LORD your God;" & *v6:13* "Fear the LORD your God, serve Him only"
- Stiff-necked (v9:6,13; 10:16; 31:27)--obstinate & difficult to lead; refuses to turn the head to change path
  - o Used 17 times in OT to describe the Jews; part of the last words said by Stephen (Acts 7:51)
  - o *v10:12-13,16,20* tell us what God wants: awe, love, obey; for these, Jesus is our model (**John** 17:1-4)
  - o v11:26-28 + chap 27-28 speak of blessing & curse based on obedience; Jesus clarified--belief in Him is the distinction between salvation & condemnation (compare John 3:16-18a with 3:18b)
- God gave rules for kings (v17:14-21); but none would keep them; only Jesus can (1 Timothy 1:17)
- The LORD promised a prophet to whom they must listen (*v18:15-19*) => "Listen to Him!" (**Matthew** 17:5)
  - o "Had you believed Moses, you would believe me" (John 5:45-47); "Truly this is the Prophet" (John 6:14); "He who sent me is with me" (John 8:28:29); "does not listen will be cut off" (Acts 3:22-23)
  - o God also gave guidance to discern false prophets (*v18:20-22*); we have confidence in prophecies yet unfulfilled (especially of the end times) because of the words of those prophets that have proven true
- *v21:23*: "anyone who is hung on a tree is under God's curse;" *v27:26*: "Cursed is he who does not put the words of this law into practice." Jesus took on the 1<sup>st</sup> curse to redeem us from the 2<sup>nd</sup> (Galatians 3:10-13)

- Offering the *firstfruits* of the harvest gave thanks (*v26:1-15; Leviticus 23:10-11*), but had a future import even greater--Jesus as the firstfruits promising the resurrection of God's people! (1 Corinthians 15:20-23)
  - In thanks give Him the best of what you have & who you are in praise & witness (Hebrews 13:15)
- Moses sings a "rock" song (*v32:4*)--God is the Rock; His people turned from Him (*v32:15,18*) yet God still seeks after them (*v32:36,43*); just as Jesus sought me (Luke 15:4; 1 Peter 2:9-10)
- Barred from entering the land, God gave Moses a view of it all (*v34:1-4*) & then he died; ~1,500 years later, he finally entered the land to appear with Elijah at Jesus' transfiguration (**Matthew 17:1-3**)

#### Jesus in Joshua

- Joshua is the first of the "Historical Books;" early Jewish tradition credited Joshua as the author
  - o 1st 5 chapters record the spiritual, moral, physical & military preparations for the conquest of Canaan
  - The key to the book is that success in battle will always be by God's power, not human strength/wiles
  - o In Hebrew, Joshua & Jesus are the same--Yeshua: "the Lord saves"
- "Be strong & courageous. . . for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (v1:9); God often said similar (Genesis 28:15; Exodus 6:6; Jeremiah 30:11; Matthew 28:20; Acts 18:10)
- Rahab believed in the Lord & protected the spies at great risk (*v2:11*); she became ancestor of Boaz (Matthew 1:5) & a "hero of faith" (Hebrews 11:31) => a great example of God's powerful grace!
- When ready to go against Jericho, Joshua encountered a man with drawn sword, who identified himself as "commander of the army of the Lord" (v5:14)--viewed as God the Son since: 1) Joshua fell down in reverence; 2) the commander declared the ground where Joshua stood as holy; 3) the LORD said to Joshua, "See, I have delivered Jericho into your hands." (v6.2) => another pre-incarnate appearance of Jesus
- Joshua's final words (Chapter 23-24) reminded that the LORD had been good to them, had fought their battles & He had kept all His promises; but he also warned against violating the covenant (v23:15-16)
  - o Words for us all: "Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve. . . As for me and my house, we will serve the LORD!" (v24:15)
  - O Jesus' last are also for us all: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
