# **Summer Study -- A Bible Overview With A Jesus Focus**

## Lesson 6: 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings

- 1 Samuel recorded the failure of the human-desired king & ended in the deaths of Saul & Jonathan
- 2 Samuel describes the establishment of David's line thru which would come the Messiah

#### Jesus in 2 Samuel

- Shows God's persistent love as He reaches out to draw David back after his sin--just as He did for each of us; no matter how deep our despair, God's love will always be there to pick us up
- Under David as king, Israel's borders reached the limits God had said they would (**Joshua 1:3-4**; *v8:1-15*)
- Jerusalem became the "City of David" (v5:9) but also the "City of God" where Jesus was presented in the temple (Luke 2:22); crucified & raised (Luke 26-28) & would reign (v7:12-13; Revelation 3:12; 21:2)
- David was a *type* of Jesus in many ways; the Jews knew he would be the Messiah's ancestor
   v7:12-14 prophecies near-term of Solomon & long term of Jesus (Luke 1:32); David wanted to build
   God a house, but God promised him one--in descendants from which the Messiah would come (v7:16)
  - o Other references to the Messiah coming from David include: Psalm 132:17-18; Isaiah 9:6-7; 11:1-10; 16:5; Jeremiah 23:5; 33:14-26; Amos 9:11; Zechariah 12:8; Micah 5:2; confirmed in Luke 1:32
  - David had gone from shepherd to king (*v7:8*); both ensure protection & provision for those they lead (**Psalm 23**; **Ezekiel 34:11-24**)--just as Jesus is our Good Shepherd (**John 10:1-18**)
  - o David virtually adopted Mephibosheth, Jonathan's son (*v9:11*)--a picture of God's adoption of each of us (**Romans 8:14-17**) despite our sin that made us His enemies (**Colossians 1:21**); further, as David restored Saul's land to Mephibosheth, so we will have restored all Adam's blessings (**Revelation 22:2**)
- David sinned horribly against God, committing adultery & murder (v11:4,15) but God forgave him when he fully repented his sin (v12:13,34-25), just as Jesus forgave Peter (Mark 16:7; John 21:15-19) & all who accept Jesus (Acts 13:38; Romans 5:1; 6:23; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 2 Peter 3:9; 1 John 2:2)
- David wept as he left Jerusalem to escape Absolom (*v15:30*); Jesus wept when Lazarus died (**John 11:14-15**) & during Holy Week because so many rejected him & would suffer terribly when Jerusalem was destroyed (Luke 19:41-44); truly He weeps today over all that still reject Him (**Revelation 20:15**)
- David knew that every success was a gift from God (v18:22-29); he was not perfect, but like Jesus, trusted God (v22:29-30; 1 Peter 2:21-24) just as we can trust Jesus (John 14:1,27; Romans 8:28-29)

### Jesus in 1 Kings

- Solomon started with a heart for God, but was drawn to the world; Jesus is the wise King of Israel & of our hearts; if we focus on Him, the world will not draw us (Colossians 3:1-4; Hebrews 12:1-2)
- When God offered Solomon anything, he chose wisdom to govern (v3:5); wisdom is the insight needed to live as God intends (Proverbs 3:13-14); Jesus is the embodiment of God's wisdom (1 Corinthians 1:30)
   Solomon's wealth was unequaled, yet he came to feel empty (Ecclesiastes); Jesus stressed that God's love & care are greater than wealth (Matthew 6:28-29) & God's kingdom is our focus (Matthew 6:33)
- God's glory filled the temple (*v8:10-11*); but His presence is predicated upon obedience (*v6:11-13--"if*"; **Isaiah 59:1-2**); His desire to live **with** us is proven in Jesus' first Advent (**John 1:14**) & the Holy Spirit's indwelling (**John 14:15-17**) whereby we are each & together God's temple (**2 Corinthians 6:16; 7:1**) 
  o The temple's magnificence paled compared to God's presence & activity (*v8:27*; **Acts 7:48-50**); this temple was only a shadow of Jesus--a temple that humans did not build (**John 2:19-21; Hebrews 9:24**) 
  o Many commentators believe Jesus was the Lord of the temple who appeared to Solomon (*v9:2*)
- Solomon's wisdom was unequaled (*v4:29*) yet he was fool (*v11:2-4*) in not following his own advice (**Proverbs 5:1-12; 18-19; 6:27-29; 7:21-23**); Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to help us (**Romans 8:26-27**) o Solomon worshipped other gods so God told him the kingdom would be divided (*v11:6-11,34*)

- God promised that David will "always have a lamp before me in Jerusalem" (v11:36)--fulfilled in Jesus
   After Solomon, the northern tribes split from Judea; thus also rejecting the Messiah's line (v12:13-16)
   The northern tribes set up idols to worship--a source of bitterness towards Samaria (John 4:9,20-26)
- Elijah forecast 3 years of drought in Israel (v17:1); he then went to a Gentile widow & asked for food though she had little; but as he promised, flour & oil were not be depleted until rain returned v17:14)
  Jesus also requested from a woman despised by the Jews (John 4) & said He was Messiah (John 4:26)
  This outcast Samaritan woman went & brought the townspeople to Jesus (John 4:28-30)--talk about a great evangelist!--I love how God empowers & uses the outcasts, lowly, sinners, etc., to do His work!
  An "Elijah" (John the Baptist) would return before the Messiah (Malachi 4:5-6; Matthew 17:9-13)
- Had a tough day? Try Elijah's--challenge, then kill Baal's 450 prophets after calling down heaven's fire, then run for his life from Jezebel & then lay down wishing to die (v19:3-5)
  But God knew & cared; He sent an angel to aid, so Elijah ate & set out on a 40-day trek (v19:6-9)
  Elijah learned that though God can shake mountains, He often speaks in a loving whisper (v19:12-13), just as Jesus' disciples saw who He was when He calmed a storm with just "Silence!" (Mark 4:39)
  Often during the storms in our lives we need to listen for a whisper to hear God (Psalm 46:10)
- Like Ahab, people today often ask when all they want to hear is self-justification rather than truth (v22:8,14,17); Jesus always told the truth in love even when people hated what He said (Mark 12:12)
   Micaiah also saw Israel as a sheep without a shepherd (v22:17); Jesus cited the parallel of the hired hand who flees from danger (John 10:12-13) rather than the Good & True Shepherd (John 10:14-17)

#### Jesus in 2 Kings

- As Israel & Judah kept slipping farther away from God, Elijah & Elisha kept calling people back
- Eliajah was taken up to heaven (*v2:11-12*), as was Jesus (**Luke 24:51; Acts 1:9**); just as will living believers (**1 Corinthians 15:51-52; 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17**)
- Elisha asked for & received a double portion of Elijah's spirit (v2:9) & Elijah left him his cloak (v2:13)-thereby "passing the mantle," as John the Baptist would when He gave witness to Jesus (John 1:6-7)
   John baptized Jesus to signal the beginning of Jesus' ministry; the Holy Spirit descended & the Father declared His approval--a display & testimony of the Holy Trinity (Matthew 3:13-17)
  - o God empowers us to accomplish what He asks--He doesn't call the qualified, but qualifies the called!
- Elisha's miracles benefitted people in turmoil (e.g., widow's oil--*v4:3-7*; a son restored to life; *v4:20,32-36*; poison in the pot--*v4:40-41*; feeding a hundred--*v4:40-41*; Naaman's leprosy--*v5:10,14*)
  - o A servant girl recommended Naaman humble himself by going to Elisha (v5:2-3) & Elisha gave him a humble task which enraged him (v5:10-12); we are to humbly serve as did Jesus (Mark 10:43-45)
  - o Jesus also performed miracles that demonstrated God's mercy & love for ordinary people, even outcasts & Gentiles; yet many still refused to believe in Him (**John 6:26; 10:31-38**)
- When the Arameans surrounded Elisha in Dothan (v6:14) he saw the LORD's horses & chariots of fire surrounding the Arameans (v6:16-17); when we place our trust in Jesus, we are never alone, with angels (Psalm 34:7; Psalm 91), Jesus Himself (Matthew 28:20; 1 John 4:4) & the Holy Spirit (John 16:5-16)
- Jehu killed all of Ahab's family (*v10:17*) as God had promised (**1 Kings 21:20-21**); He always keeps His promises; we can count on everything Jesus promised us (just two promises of many--**John 3:36; 6:35**)
- Israel suffered the consequences of worshipping idols, disregarding God's commandments & ignoring His warnings (*v17:6*); God is patient, loving & merciful but also holy--Jesus will judge! (**Revelation 20:12**)
- The Hebrews merged worship of the one true God with worship of the culture's idols (*v18:4*); we must not adopt the world's values (**Romans 12:2**) & worship God for who He is, not what He does (**John 6:26-27**)
- Josiah was stunned to realize how far the nation had deviated from God's Word (*v22:13*); Jesus confirmed God's Word as still valid (**Matthew 5:17**) & urged us to deny self & follow Him (**Matthew 16:24-27**)
- Jerusalem fell (*v25:1-10*) & would again, but Jesus will reign in the New Jerusalem (**Revelation 21-22**)
