Summer Study -- A Bible Overview With A Jesus Focus Lesson 9: Psalms 23 thru 57

Jesus in Psalms Part 2 – (over 100 prophecies of Jesus in the Psalms, as well as many connections)

- **Psalm 23**¹ The shepherd as leader of God's people is a significant & frequent theme in the Old Testament
 - Israel's leaders had failed in their job of leading God's people & would be replaced (Ezekiel 34:8-10)
 - *v1 The Lord is my shepherd. . .not want*--worshipful praise for leadership that protects, guides & provides all that is needed; only Jesus, our *Good Shepherd*, fills that role (**John 10:1-21; Hebrews 13:20-21**)

> Those who heard Jesus say: "I am the Good Shepherd" (John 10:11) understood it as a claim of deity!

- v2a Lie down--sheep lie down when fed, watered & secure; our Shepherd feeds with His Word, waters via the Holy Spirit's grace & promises eternal security (Ezekiel 34:15; John 5:24; 6:68; 10:9,27-28; 17:2)
- *v2b Quiet waters*--in joy accept the peace of Christ (Zechariah 9:16-17; 1 Peter 2:25; Revelation 7:17)
- v3a Restores my soul--something we all need at one time or another: like a sheep that is "cast" on its back & cannot recover on its' own due to a heavy coat, so are we when in spiritual malaise of sin & despair
 - > As the "cast" sheep is vulnerable to predators, we are vulnerable to Satan's attacks when "down-cast"
 - As the shepherd treats the "cast" sheep tenderly, Jesus treats us when we confess: seeking & lovingly calling His lost to draw close (Psalm 34:10; Luke 13:34; 15:4-7; James 4:8; 1 John 4:19)
- v3b Guides me. . .righteousness--submitting to & following Jesus does not avoid hardships but will end up much better for us! (Proverbs 3:5-7; 14:12; Mark 8:34; John 10:27-29; Ephesians 2:10)

> As we walk with Jesus, we grow deeper in relationship (Psalm 119:66; 2 Corinthians 7:1; 12:9)

- v4a You are with me--in the darkest of times (Isaiah 41:10; Philippians 4:6; Hebrews 13:5)
- v4b Your rod & staff, they comfort me--rod to fight off predators (1 Samuel 17:34-35) as Jesus' strength & protection + staff to guide & control with loving discipline show devotion to His flock (John 10:15)
- v5a Prepare a table--showing close relationship between a generous host & an honored guest (Philippians 4:9); presence of my enemies--we feel no threat (Ephesians 3:16-19; Hebrews 4:16)
 All believen will be invited to the Lopp's table (Lope 12:20; Benefative 10:10: 21:2 4)
 - > All believers will be invited to the LORD's table (Luke 13:29; Revelation 19:19; 21:2-4)
- v5b Anoint my head--custom for esteemed guests to refresh & give joy (John 14:23; 15:11; Hebrews 1:9)
- *v5c* My cup overflows--our LORD provides abundantly (Malach 3:10; Luke 11:13; Ephesians 3:20)
- *v6a* Goodness & mercy--trust in God's promises (Romans 8:32; Ephesians 2:4-5; 2 Corinthians 1:20)
- *v6b* Dwell in the house of the LORD forever--those that accept Jesus have the assurance of eternal life with Him (John 3:15-16; 5:24; 10:28; 14:2-3; 17:2-3; Romans 6:23; 1 John 2:25; Revelation 21:2-4)
- Psalm 24 celebrates the LORD's entrance to Zion, perhaps sung bringing the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem
 - Points to: Jesus' ascension to glory (Acts 2:33; Philippians 2:9) and/or 2nd coming as King of kings & Lord of lords (Zechariah 14:1-9; Acts 1:11; 1 Timothy 6:14-15; Revelation 19:11-16)
 - *v3-4* Who may ascend?...who has a pure heart--we are qualified by faith in Jesus (Hebrews 10:29-22)
- Psalm 27 David expressed absolute trust in God's abiding love & protection, as did Paul (Romans 8:31-39)
 - We are secure: Jesus promised He would lose none that His Father had given Him (John 6:39; 10:28-29) & to be with us as we go thru the trials of life (Matthew 28:20; John 14:18; 1 John 4:4)
- **Psalm 30** Following Jesus doesn't mean you won't face trials, which test & grow faith (**1 Peter 1:6-7**)
 - v1 In your darkest hours, remember: you too will later be able to proclaim "You have lifted me up," for Jesus is always with you to strengthen & bolster, as He did in visiting John (Revelation 1:9,12-13)
 - v3 You pulled me up from Sheol--prophesies Jesus' Resurrection (Acts 2:32)
 - HPC has been blessed with a parade of saints that, even in their last trials, placed trust in Christ's promise

- Psalm 31 has several prophesies of Jesus' passion: v5 His last words on the cross (Luke 23:46); v11 His disciples deserting Him (Mark 14:50); v13 the conspiracy to put Him to death (John 11:53; Matthew 27:1); v14 the Jewish leaders knew He trusted in God & used that to mock Him on the cross (Matthew 27:43)
 Yet, He recognized, as we must, being secure in the hands of His loving Father (v14-15; 1 Peter 5:10)
- Psalm 32:1-2 (cited in Romans 4:3-8,22-25) declares our being forgiven & credited with righteousness as a
- free gift from God; can't be earned--as Jesus cried out: "It is finished!" tetelestai--paid in full (John 19:30)
- Psalm 33:1-3 urges us to sing to the LORD, as Jesus & disciples did at the Last Supper (Matthew 26:30)
- Psalm 34:20 prophesies that none of Jesus' bones would be broken (Exodus 12:46; John 19:31-36)
- Psalm 35 v4,7,19 look to hatred Jesus faced (John 15:24-25); v11,15 to false witnesses (Matthew 26:59-61)
 Jesus told the Jewish leaders they belonged to their father, the devil (John 8:44-47), who was/is the force behind the hatred for Jesus as well as the world's hatred for God's people (John15:18-25)
- **Psalm 37:4** tells us to "Delight yourself in the LORD, and He will give you the desires of your heart;" Jesus promised us sustaining grace (**1 Corinthians 1:8-9**) & eternal life with Him (**Matthew 19:29**)
 - *v11 The meek will inherit the land*--quoted in Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:5)
 - We obtain the desired type of meekness by using Jesus as our model for humbly putting others first, developing patient endurance (*v7-8,34*), reverence for & obedience to God (**Matthew 11:28-29**)
- **Psalm 38** prophecies of Jesus: *v11*: friends & kin distanced themselves (**Luke 23:49**); *v12*: enemies sought to entrap Him (**Mark 14:1; Matthew 22:15**); *v13-14*: He kept silent before His accusers (**Matthew 27:12-14**); *v19*: enemies & hatred without reason (**John 15:24-25**); *v20*: He went about doing good (**Acts 10:38**)
- Psalm 40 prophecies of Jesus: *v2-5*: joy of His resurrection (John 20:20); *v6-8*: Hs was set to do the will of His Father (John 4:34; Hebrews 10:5-10; 12:2-3) even to death (Luke 22:42; Philippians 2:8); *v9*: He preached righteousness (Matthew 4:17); *v14* He was confronted by adversaries in the Garden (John 18:4-6)
- Psalm 41 A prayer of deliverance famous for v9 which prophecies of Judas' betrayal (John 13:18)
 Jesus told us to love & pray for our enemies, even as He did from the cross (Matthew 5:44; Luke 23:34)
- **Psalm 45** most applies as a song of the Messiah, anticipating the marriage of the Lamb (**Revelation 19:7**)
 - *v2* Words of grace from His lips (John 1:17; Luke 4:22); *v6* is repeated in Hebrews 1:8 about the Son
 - v7 Anointed by the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:16; Hebrews 1:9); Anointed =Messiah (Christ) (Luke 2:11)
 - o *v16* Jesus' bride has many children--as God's vine with many branches (John 15:4; Romans 11:17-21)
 - *v17* His name will be remembered forever (Ephesians 1:20-21; Hebrews 1:8)
- **Psalm 46** was the basis of Luther's hymn "A Mighty Fortress is our God"--the song of the Reformation
 - *v2-3 We will not fear.* . .*though their waters roar*--Jesus calmed the wind & waters (Luke 8:22-25), just as He can calm the storms in our lives when we have faith in Him (Acts 16:31; Romans 10:9)

 - *v10-11* God is with us & in control -- no matter how crazy & terrible this world gets!
- Psalm 49 testifies to the folly of pursuing worldly things; no amount of money can ransom from the grave
 v15 proclaims God as the only security--the agent of redemption is Jesus (Matthew 20:28; John 14:6)
- Psalm 51 After Nathan confronted him about Uriah & Bathsheba, David felt the broken relationship with God, admitted his sin & begged for mercy & forgiveness (*v1-4*) with a broken & contrite heart (*v17*)
 Our God offers reconciliation thru Jesus (Isaiah 1:18; John 3:16-17; 2 Corinthians 5:17-19; 1 John 1:9)
- Psalm 55 David is again beset & begs God for help, but deepest pain comes from a friend's betrayal (v13-14)
 This points to Judas, who even used a kiss of friendship & affection to betray Jesus (Matthew 26:49)
- Psalm 57 Fleeing from Saul, David declares his refuge in God (v1) & recognizes God's faithfulness (v10)
- Jesus has partially & will totally fulfill *v5,11*: He was the agent of creation (John 1:1-4); conquered sin & death for our salvation (Romans 4:23-25) & is our strength & cornerstone (Ephesians 2:20; 4:16); He will reign as our eternal King (Revelation 11:15) to whom all will bow (Philippians 2:10-11)
